Last month, our team of *Promotoras de Salud*, or Community Health Promoters, wrapped up the workshops for the *Run, Move, and Prevent Diabetes* campaign in Le Sueur and Worthington, with 28 community members taking part. Alongside the Free Clinic of St. Peter, Open Door, Nicollet County, and the Department of Health, we organized a vaccination and resources event in St. Peter, MN.

The COPAL team also joined Driver and Vehicle Services (DVS) in Mankato to show support for the newly eligible community members processing their driver's licenses in Minnesota under the new law *Licenses for All.*

# Primero de Mayo Workers' Center

In the past month, we successfully placed 10 individuals in stable jobs, contributing to their economic stability and career growth. This accomplishment underscores our commitment to empowering members of our community through stable and dignified employment.

We're thrilled to announce that the Workers' Center has received approval from the DVS to administer theoretical exams for obtaining a driver's license in Minnesota. This is a crucial step in enhancing accessibility and opportunities for our community members. Stay tuned for more information on this exciting development!

Our open hours and recent citizenship fair were well-attended, with a total of 81 individuals benefiting from our services. Our clothing distribution and resource fair at the Workers' Center was also a resounding success! During the event, 143 individuals, including adults and children, acquired winter clothing. Additionally, 39 individuals received the COVID-19 vaccine, and 37 received the influenza vaccine. Questions about resources? Call us at (612) 427-2011.

COPAL has also launched a paid internship program through our Workers' Center aimed at providing young participants with a unique opportunity to actively contribute to the long-term design of the metro area. Participants will engage in a blend of fun activities, research, conversations, and learning on regional policy. The internship offers \$25 per hour, free meals at workshops, and access to valuable resources such as pre-paid transportation cards, and wealth justice guidance. 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# Health & Wellness

Over the past three months, our Health Promoters have engaged with over 150 community members in both rural and urban areas of Minnesota. Their focus has been on raising awareness about diabetes prevention and promoting healthy lifestyles within the Latino community. Collaborating with the Health and Wellness team, they successfully facilitated 15 community educational workshops in the Minnesota towns of Jordan, Brooklyn Park, Kasson, Worthington, Le Sueur, Madelia, and Rochester.

During these sessions, 79 participants gained valuable insights into the significance of a healthy diet, physical activity, maintaining a balanced plate, portion sizes, and deciphering product labels. Attendees established personalized goals towards adopting healthier habits. Some reported increased daily water intake and incorporating more vegetables into their diets. Others began monitoring and controlling their consumption of sugars and carbohydrates after learning to read product labels. Remarkably, one participant discovered the need to consult with a doctor through the program, resulting in a diabetes diagnosis. Armed with newfound knowledge, this individual now has the tools to manage their health effectively.

On November 4th, the Health Promoters' team gathered to celebrate achievements, assess lessons learned, and mark the conclusion of COPAL's first-year Health Promoters Program. Stay tuned as we prepare to recruit for the upcoming year!
