


Workers' Rights and Environmental Justice

May 1st celebrates International Workers' Day, so the month of May is a chance to reflect on workers' rights. Environmental justice and workers' rights are intersecting themes: Workers in our communities often face harsh working conditions, including exposure to pollution and climate extremes.

There are several jobs where workers are forced to work in extreme weather conditions including street vending, construction, farming, and roofing. Often, these workers face the dangers of hot weather, freezing temperatures, and exposure to harsh toxins and pollution.

It is through knowing our workers' rights and advocating for better working conditions that we have the power to change these injustices faced by our workers. COPAL advances worker education and worker organizing through the Primero de Mayo Workers' Center.





Carolina Ortiz: CERTs Community Energy Ambassador

Carolina Ortiz, Associate Executive Director of COPAL, joined CERTs (Clean Energy and Resource Teams) to share her story and leadership in advancing COPAL's mission through environmental justice to ensure that there is a just energy transition for all communities in Minnesota.

Carolina shares her personal story and draws connections between her lived experiences and the systematic issues faced by community members. Through Carolina's leadership, COPAL has been able to share ways to make the transition to clean energy more equitable. COPAL has hosted workshops and events discussing clean energy and resources available such as the <u>Inflation Reduction Act</u>, a federal law passed to incentive people to reduce their carbon emissions.

This project was conducted as one of CERTs Community Energy Ambassadors stories. Community Energy Ambassadors advance clean energy projects within their communities and gain access to the knowledge and skills needed to help others meaningfully participate in the clean energy transition.
