This month, COPAL's South Central Initiative has been active in St. Peter, organizing door-to-door outreach events promoting protection against flu and COVID-19. We've also hosted resource tables offering information on vaccination events and community health opportunities.

Community partners play a vital role in our outreach and engagement efforts. This month, we connected with 30 community members at the Mankato Adult Basic Education School, sharing resources on COVID-19 and flu vaccinations. Our community health leader, Ana Ruth Castaneda, led the door-to-door outreach event in St. Peter, collaborating with the Free Clinic to distribute vaccination and resource information.



COP29 in Bakú, Azerbaiyán

COPAL's Environmental Justice Coordinator, Melody Arteaga, will be joining Climate Generation's delegation at COP29 in Baku, Azerbaijan. COP29, or the 29th "Conference of the Parties," is a major global event where representatives from nearly every country gather to address the critical issue of climate change. Each year, these conferences focus on finding solutions to limit global warming, protect ecosystems, and help communities adapt to the impacts of climate change.



COPAL's participation in COP29 is crucial to ensure that the voices of frontline communities are heard and that our concerns are prioritized.
