Our team at COPAL Rochester is dedicated to supporting community members seeking guidance on immigration issues, job assistance, and navigating medical bills and driver's licenses by connecting individuals with the appropriate resources and professionals. Each month, we host a free vaccination event and actively engage with the community to listen to their concerns and provide information.

On October 26, we will provide the updated COVID-19 and flu vaccines, along with information from Contigo LifePath Counseling LLC about their counseling and therapy services. We also want to share that we were invited to the Mobile Mexican Consulate in Austin, where we provided resources on driver's licenses and the opportunity to take the theoretical exam at our office.

SOUTH CENTRAL INITIATIVE MANKATO, MN

In September, we celebrated the third anniversary of COPAL's South Central Initiative with the event "Celebrating Victories, Dignifying Lives," which was attended by more than 40 people, including community leaders and members.





During this event, we shared knowledge with community partners who have been essential to COPAL's vision in the South Central region of Minnesota. Additionally, the leadership team presented the victories achieved and the call to action for the construction of Latino Center for Community Engagement (LCCE). HEALTH AND WELLNESS

In September, we joined the Latino Fest in Rochester, where we set up a resource table to share information about our programs in Southeast Minnesota. We engaged with the community about climate change and its impact on our health and distributed emergency kits. We also had games and prizes for children and visitors.

Additionally, we collaborated with Tri-Valley Head Start on September 26, bringing vaccines and resources to the community of Owatonna, where we administered 33 vaccines for Covid-19 and the flu.

ORGANIZING

COPAL has reached a significant milestone by surpassing 100,000 calls to Latine voters in Minnesota as part of our ongoing efforts to ensure eligible voters are engaged, informed, and ready to participate in the upcoming elections. Our outreach campaign, led by a dedicated team of staff and volunteers, has focused on providing essential information about voter registration, polling locations, and the importance of local races. COPAL's expanded voter outreach



campaign will continue through Election Day.

"By setting a new goal of 150,000 calls, we aim to further mobilize and empower eligible Latino voters to make their voices heard on November 5." said Ryan Perez, COPAL's Organizing Director.

What Have We Done?

- In September, we concluded our health and safety workshops, with successful sessions held in Minneapolis and Rochester.
- We have been offering orientations before the theoretical license test, averaging about 20 participants per session.
- These talks are conducted twice a week and one Sunday a month, helping more workers succeed in their exams.
- During the recent citizenship fair, 17 individuals received assistance with their applications and signed up for classes, while one person registered for the GED.

We would like to express our gratitude to everyone who made the recent citizenship fair possible, organized in collaboration with the Immigrant Law Center and Normandale College. Their support and participation were vital in providing valuable resources to our community.

Additionally, we are raising awareness in the community about the new Earned Sick and Safe Time (ESST) law. Our aim is to educate workers about their rights and promote stable employment, ensuring that everyone is aware of their benefits and responsibilities.

COPAL 2024 College Tour: Extractivism & Conflict in Latin America

Our speaker spends a week in Minnesota, visiting and speaking at 5-7 colleges/universities across the state.

This year, we are honored to welcome Michael Wilson Becerril as our College Tour speaker! Michael brings a unique perspective and blend of academia and grassroots advocacy through his time in Mexico, Peru, Costa Rica, and Guyana. We will be visiting colleges in the metro area, Western, and Southern Minnesota touching on themes such as extractivism and conflict in Latin America, as well as the importance of civic engagement in ensuring our voices are heard!
