SOUTHEAST INITIATIVE ROCHESTER, MN

Our team at COPAL Rochester has been diligently working with individuals who visit our office seeking information to obtain immigration legal advice, employment support, assistance with medical bills, driver's licenses, programs and services available, and knowledge exam preparation at the DVS.

- On June 18, we participated in a community health event in Elgin, MN, held at Tri Valley Head Start. COPAL coordinated a COVID-19 vaccination clinic where, in addition to vaccinations, we distributed smartwatches to encourage our community to prioritize their health.
- On June 29, we conducted a Workplace Health workshop where participants learned about some of the most common hazards at work. All attendees received participation certificates and left feeling better prepared to identify workplace risks and be able to report incidents to OSHA.
- On June 27, COPAL's Rochester staff was invited to attend the Annual Partner Celebration hosted by Olmsted United Way. This year, COPAL Southeast Initiative applied and was chosen, along with two other organizations, to receive a grant to support our civic engagement work in the Latine community. This achievement will benefit our community by empowering them to use their voice to advocate for more just and inclusive policies.

SOUTH CENTRAL INITIATIVE MANKATO, MN

Our South Central team has played a pivotal role in local community events in St. Peter and Mankato, where we have provided vital resources such as COVID-19 vaccination clinics. Additionally, we have been offering classes to study the Minnesota driver's manual and are working to open up a knowledge exam center to obtain a driver's license in South Central Minnesota

We are excited about the upcoming Back-to-School Fair in Madelia and Mankato, where we will have resource booths, backpacks, and school supplies for the community. We recently hosted Vice Governor

PRIMERO DE MAYO WORKERS CENTER

During the past month, our team has been actively involved in various initiatives to strengthen our community. We implemented workshops focused on the health and safety of minors, as well as raising awareness about chemical hazards in workplace settings. Simultaneously, we launched a scholarship aimed at young individuals about to start college, and we're excited to announce that we've received 20 applications, with half of them set to benefit from this opportunity! Additionally, we've been offering weekly workshops for those seeking employment, covering everything from resume-building to interview preparation, and using public transportation and translators to improve communication.

Looking ahead, we are excited to offer new workshops specifically designed to prepare the selected scholarship recipients for their upcoming educational journey.

What else have we been up to?

- A recent notable achievement includes receiving recognition from the Minnesota Attorney General's Office due to a wage theft case affecting a group of workers participating in our programs, highlighting the positive impact of our advocacy among Latine workers.
- We have strengthened our collaboration with Representative Ilhan Omar's office, facilitating the resolution of work permit issues for workers and ensuring a more streamlined process and effective legal support.

We invite everyone to participate in our programs and educational workshops, designed to promote labor rights and provide training in technology use. In particular, we highlight our program for senior citizens, which includes access to tablets, thus providing essential tools for their digital empowerment.











HEAITH AND WELLNESS

During June, we continued our commitment to the health of our community through vaccination clinics. Furthermore, we successfully completed the third session of Preventive Community Health classes that covered topics such as navigating Minnesota's healthcare system and healthy strategies for stress management.

We continue to make a significant impact through preventive activities and by promoting updated COVID-19 vaccination among the Latine community. We also focus our efforts on educating about chronic diseases, healthy lifestyles, and mental health.

We actively participated in the MPS Summer Celebration and Resource Fair on June 13th at Whittier International Elementary School in Minneapolis. During this event, we shared crucial information about resources offered by COPAL, as well as information on mental health, cardiovascular disease prevention, and access to low-cost medical care or insurance through the state. We engaged in approximately 200 meaningful conversations with attendees. We also collaborated with Ascension Church in Minneapolis, through a community resource fair, where we shared vital information about community resources and preventive health.















ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE

In June, COPAL's Environmental Justice team, along with a youth leader, attended the CPD's Green Social Housing retreat in North Carolina. During the event, COPAL met with organizations from over 10 states to strategize on the next steps in CPD's national housing campaign.

Our commitment is to support the construction of a "green" housing system, which entails ensuring that heating and cooling systems are safe, healthy, and clean. Additionally, infrastructure such as apartment buildings should have solar panels and be weather-resistant to reduce environmental impact, while ensuring equitable and affordable access for BIPOC communities.

During the retreat, community members engaged in two actions: one advocating for the rights of mobile home tenants and another in support of a family facing unjustified eviction. COPAL supported these actions, defending housing dignity and delving into the impact of corporate landlords on the housing system at large.

What a fantastic day it was at COPAL Family Day! We extend our heartfelt thanks to the community, COPAL members, and families who joined us in celebrating our victories. Together, we are making strides towards a more inclusive Minnesota.


