COP29 in Bakú, Azerbaiyán

COPAL's Environmental Justice Coordinator, Melody Arteaga, will be joining <u>Climate Generation's</u> <u>delegation to COP29</u> in Baku, Azerbaijan.

What is COP?

COP29, or the 29th "Conference of the Parties," is a global gathering where representatives from nearly every country come together to address climate change. Each year, these conferences focus on finding solutions to limit global warming, protect ecosystems, and help communities adapt to climate impacts.

At COP29, countries will negotiate commitments to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, transition to renewable energy sources like wind and solar, and support nations vulnerable to climate disasters such as hurricanes, droughts, and floods. The goal is to create international cooperation, with each country pledging specific actions to meet the targets set under the Paris Agreement—a global effort to limit global warming to well below 2 degrees Celsius, ideally closer to 1.5 degrees.

As climate discussions continue on a global stage, COPAL's presence at COP29 is vital to ensure that frontline communities' voices are heard, and our concerns are prioritized. These conversations will shape policies that affect us all, especially those most impacted by the climate crisis. Our communities must be included in the decisions that will ultimately affect our lives and futures.
