SOUTH CENTRAL INITIATIVE MANKATO, MN

In August, the South Central Initiative team hosted several resource fairs, health workshops, and community events in Madelia, Mankato, Le Sueur and St. Peter, ensuring that Latine communities in Greater Minnesota have access to the resources they need to lead more dignified lives. There, they connected community members with health and school supplies, while also sharing information and engaging in conversations about the impact of climate change on our health.

Additionally, the team worked to ensure that community members had access to the latest COVID-19 vaccines and flu shots, preparing them for the upcoming fall season. Regional Committee for Southeast MN meeting

Last month, the COPAL Regional Committee for Southeast Minnesota met to explore the barriers faced by Latine families in the region and discuss collaborative strategies to overcome these challenges. These meetings are not only an opportunity for problem-solving but also for engaging in activities that strengthen and unify our community. Our team also participated in a community health fair in Elgin, Minnesota to provide COVID-19 vaccines, distribute science kits to children, and share additional resources, furthering our commitment to supporting community health and education.

Our Southeast Office also hosted a community listening session, conducted in partnership with the Minnesota Council of Latino Affairs (MCLA) and the Alliance of Chicanos, Hispanics, and Latin Americans (ACHLA). Community members were joined by Representative Kim Hicks (District 25A) and the Director of Common Cause Minnesota. Community members shared about pressing issues affecting the Latine community in Rochester and surrounding areas, including education, health, economic development, and community growth. Attendees were motivated by the year's accomplishments and eager to continue working together to enhance the quality of life for Latine families in Minnesota.

We are excited to announce that as of September 12th, COPAL's office in Rochester serves as a testing site for the driving knowledge exam. PRIMERO DE MAYO WORKERS' CENTER

In August, we conducted an extensive report on the theoretical driving tests administered at our Workers' Center. We recorded a total of 723 individuals taking the test, with 284 successfully passing. We have introduced new test hours to better accommodate the community:

- 40,000 Dials: Reached out to Latine voters across Minnesota.
- 1,000 Doors Knocked: Engaged directly with community members.
- 1,500 Pledges to Vote: Encouraged many to commit to voting.

ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE

¡GAF Vete Ya! GAF is North America's largest roofing manufacturer. Their asphalt shingle factories are polluting BIPOC and low-income communities across the U.S. Residents living next to GAF factories have documented many of the quality of life and public health issues caused by GAF in their communities and are fighting for GAF to go.

On Monday, August 19th, organizers from Dallas and Minneapolis gathered to participate in a direct action against GAF. Before the action, COPAL hosted a town hall conversation with members at COPAL's office. The emphasis of the conversation was on green housing as part of a just energy transition and a recognition of cumulative impacts.

After the town hall, COPAL members were able to connect the theory of green housing and a just transition with the practice of protesting the major local polluters in the housing industry.
