Primero de Mayo Workers' Center

This month marked an exciting milestone for the Worker Center's Youth Committee, as they hosted their first official event! Young leaders from across Minnesota came together to celebrate summer, build connections, and engage in dialogue around the issues that matter most to them. The event created space for relationship-building, sharing information, and coordinating future initiatives led by and for youth in our communities.



In addition to youth organizing, the Worker Center continues to expand essential training and support programs, helping our community members access the tools they need to thrive:

- **CNA Program (Certified Nursing Assistant):**We currently have 70 people enrolled, and 9 participants have already completed over 50% of the course—showing what's possible when our community members have access to the tools and opportunities they deserve. This isn't just progress; it's proof that when doors open, our community walks through them—building stronger futures in healthcare and beyond.
- Driver's License Assistance, US Citizenship Classes, and Basic Computer Skills Classes:
 Offering foundational training to support digital literacy and resources among immigrant
 and working-class communities. By opening doors to essential skills and knowledge,
 we're helping to level the playing field and ensure our communities can fully participate
 and thrive.

Environmental Justice

June was full of rich, nature-based learning experiences. On June 14, families joined our Fossil Hunting Field Trip, exploring ancient rock formations and uncovering the geological story of our region.



On June 21, we held a powerful **Inti Raymi celebration**—an Andean solstice ceremony honoring the sun. Students from Lincoln International High School joined in, bringing offerings and dancing with pride in their cultural heritage. The day began with tree planting, symbolizing care for the earth, and ended with a communal sharing of food, gratitude, and spiritual reconnection with nature.

On June 22, we hosted a **workshop on the Emerald Ash Borer (EAB)** at our office, where participants learned to identify infested trees and received bilingual guidance from certified arborists. Keep yourself updated on <u>our events here</u>.

MANKATO South Central Initiative

In June, our team held over 150 conversations at community events across Mankato, St. Peter, and New Ulm, offering resources on health insurance, long COVID, the MN driver's license exam, labor rights, and more. We also shared information about the Regional Members and Latino Leadership Committee and the importance of knowing your rights.

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We were proud to attend the New Ulm Immigration Forum alongside 17 community members from Brown County, and thank the 12 Regional Committee members who participated in the No Kings Rally in Mankato.

Municipal Resolutions Campaign: Cities Taking a Stand

On July 21, alongside over 90 organizations in the Immigrant Defense Network, COPAL helped launch the Municipal Resolutions Campaign at the Minnesota State Capitol. This initiative calls on local governments to publicly denounce mass deportations and the separation of families, and to pass resolutions in defense of immigrant communities. This campaign is just the beginning. We aim to reach cities across the state to build political will and show that Minnesotans reject cruelty and division.
